Bringing healthy summer meals to community children ensures kids have a healthy vacation and return to school ready to learn.

Hemphill ISD will connect children 18 and younger and enrolled student with disabilities up to 21 years old with healthy, no cost summer meals. The Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) is a U.S. Department of Agriculture nutrition program administered in the Lone Star State by the Texas Department of Agriculture (TDA). For the children who rely on school meals during the academic year, these meals offer a source of good nutrition when school is out for the long summer vacation.

Children need good nutrition year-round so they can learn, grow and succeed in life.

- June 7 thru the 24
- July 5 thru the 22
- Breakfast 7:30 until 8:30
- Lunch 11:00 until 12:00
- Monday thru Thursday only
- Meals will be served at the School Cafeteria, also you can come pick up a meal to go inside school cafeteria or at back door.

Hemphill ISD is one of nonprofit organizations partnering with TDA to serve meals across Texas.

Organizations partner with TDA to serve meals in areas where more than 50 percent of children are eligible for free or reduced-price meals in the National School Lunch Program. Eligible sponsoring organizations include schools, faith-based groups, nonprofit summer camps, government agencies and other tax-exempt organizations. All meal sites must be sponsored by an organization that has a contract with TDA.

Summer meal sites help children succeed by providing the nourishment they need to return to school in the fall ready to thrive.
